

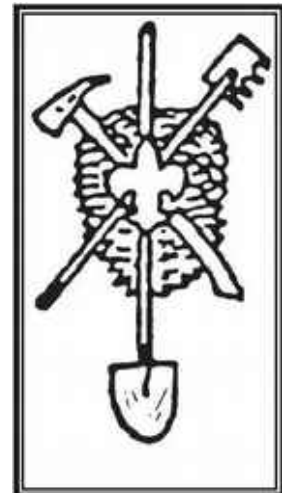
Master TrailBuilder

This award was established several years ago by the Los Angeles Area Council (now the Greater Los Angeles Area Council) to recognize continued service to the conservation programs of the USDA-Forest Service and the LAAC/GLAAC. Receiving one is not a matter of completing a set of requirements, but of unselfish dedication to the conservation of our forests and trails. Jim Spencer, LAAC-HAT, was the initial recipient in 1998, in recognition of his 30 years of developing and promoting conservation and the Trail Boss training programs in the Angeles National Forest.
